



# Introducing Mark Ford Collaboration and Training Coordinator for National Relief Charities

Mark originally is from Alamosa, Colorado and is of Chiricahua Apache and Spanish descent. Mark spent 17 years as a Roman Catholic priest in the Vincentian Order of priests and brothers (founded by St. Vincent de Paul). He spent seven years working as a pastor on the Navajo and Hopi Reservations in Page and Tuba City, Arizona. He also ministered in parishes in Dallas, Texas and New Orleans, Louisiana and worked in campus ministry in Arkansas. He was also part of the Vincentian Evangelization Team

which conducted workshops in Intercultural Communications in the South. He worked with young adults and youth during his time as a priest and was the Vocation Director, in charge of recruiting young men for the priesthood and religions life in the Vincentian Order.

Mark was assigned to working in New Orleans, Louisiana at the time of Hurricane Katrina in 2005 and was appointed by Governor Kathleen Blanco to be the Assistant Director of Disability Affairs in March 2006 to assist persons with disabilities in accessing resources and services after the hurricane. He was then appointed by Governor Bobby Jindal as the Executive Director of the Governor's Office of Indian Affairs in 2008 assisting the 19+ tribes, especially after Hurricanes Gustav and Ike in their recovery efforts.

Seeking a change of career outside church and state politics, Mark took a sabbatical and came this summer to South Dakota for a family visit in Hermosa and decided to make it his home. Mark began working as the Collaboration and Training Coordinator at NRC on November 29, 2010 and looks forward to being part of the Team at National Relief Charities.

# Community Events




What qualifies as a community event?

By NRC's definition a community event is any event that promotes education, health, or any other positive activity involving the community. Below are some additional guidelines:



- Must have a stated purpose that is in line with NRC's mission
- Topic of event can only occur once per quarter
- Have a well developed event plan
- Open to the community
- Needs to be more than just a meal
- Non-revenue generating (no rodeos and no Pow wows)
- Must estimate number of persons anticipated to attend
